Vatican II

"Therefore, like the Christian religion itself, all the preaching of the Church must be nourished and regulated by Sacred Scripture. For in the sacred books, the Father who is in heaven meets His children with great love and speaks with them; and the force and power in the word of God is so great that it stands as the support and energy of the Church, the strength of faith for her sons, the food of the soul, the pure and everlasting source of spiritual life." (DV 21)


Post-Vatican II

1966-1969: Under the directives of Pope Paul VI, Cardinals Bea and Willebrands, successive presidents of the Secretariat for Promoting Christian Unity, organised the contacts between representatives of Biblical associations across the world in order to work towards the implementation of the DEI VERBUM's chapter 6: "Sacred Scripture in the Life of the Church"




CBF Purpose

Const. 9.1. (...) promote and develop the Biblical Pastoral Ministry in such a way as to allow the Word of God as present in Sacred Scripture to become a dynamic source of inspiration for all areas of the life and mission of the **<u>Church in today's world</u>**, following the lines set forth in the Second Vatican Council's Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation "Dei Verbum" and in the Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation "Verbum Domini", as well as in the documents of the Pontifical Biblical Commission, and in collaboration with the Bishops and the Bishops' Conferences


CBF Structure - Regions





Development of the CBF - main facts

- 1972 1st Plenary Assembly, Vienna (Austria); General Secretariat transferred to Stuttgart (Germany)
- 1978 2nd Plenary Assembly, Malta: "Biblical Spirituality"
- **1984 3rd Plenary Assembly**, Bangalore (India): "God's Prophetic People"
- **1990 4th Plenary Assembly**, Bogotá (Colombia): "The Bible in the New Evangelisation"





CBF Plenary Assembly Bogotá (1990)

8.1.1 We appeal to Bishops and Bishops' Conferences to ensure that the Dogmatic Constitution *Dei Verbum* is implemented in the various dioceses and regions through the establishment of biblical-pastoral centres or institutes.

8.1.2 We appeal to Bishops and Bishops' Conferences to give the biblical apostolate the priority it deserves in their pastoral endeavours and to encourage it through the formulation of a biblical-pastoral plan and through the conscientization of the faithful through pastoral letters on the biblical apostolate or other appropriate means such as the celebration of Bible Sundays, weeks, months or even a Bible year, especially in those areas where this is not yet a practice.

8.1.3 We appeal to Bishops and Bishops' Conferences to dedicate the next Synod of the Bishops to "Biblical-Pastoral Ministry" so that the relative neglect of the Conciliar Document "Dei Verbum" may be set right.

"Verbum Domini" (2010)

"The Synod called for a particular pastoral commitment to emphasizing the centrality of the word of God in the Church's life, and recommended a greater "biblical apostolate", not alongside other forms of pastoral work, but as the Biblical animation of all pastoral life. This does not mean adding a meeting here or there in parishes or dioceses, but rather of examining the ordinary activities of Christian communities, in parishes, associations and movements, to see if they are truly concerned with fostering a personal encounter with Christ, who gives himself to us in his word. Since "ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ", the **Biblical animation of** every ordinary and extraordinary pastoral outreach will lead to a greater awareness of the person of Christ, who reveals the Father and is the fullness of divine revelation" (VD 73)

Evangelii Gaudium (2013)

"Not only the homily has to be nourished by the word of God. All evangelisation is based on that word, listened to, meditated upon, lived, celebrated and witnessed to. The sacred Scriptures are the very source of evangelisation. Consequently, we need to be constantly trained in hearing the word. The Church does not evangelise unless she constantly lets herself be evangelised. It is indispensable that the word of God "be ever more fully at the heart of every ecclesial activity". God's word, listened to and celebrated, above all in the Eucharist, nourishes and inwardly strengthens Christians, enabling them to offer an authentic witness to the Gospel in daily life" (EG 174).


